Y5 CLAY TILES

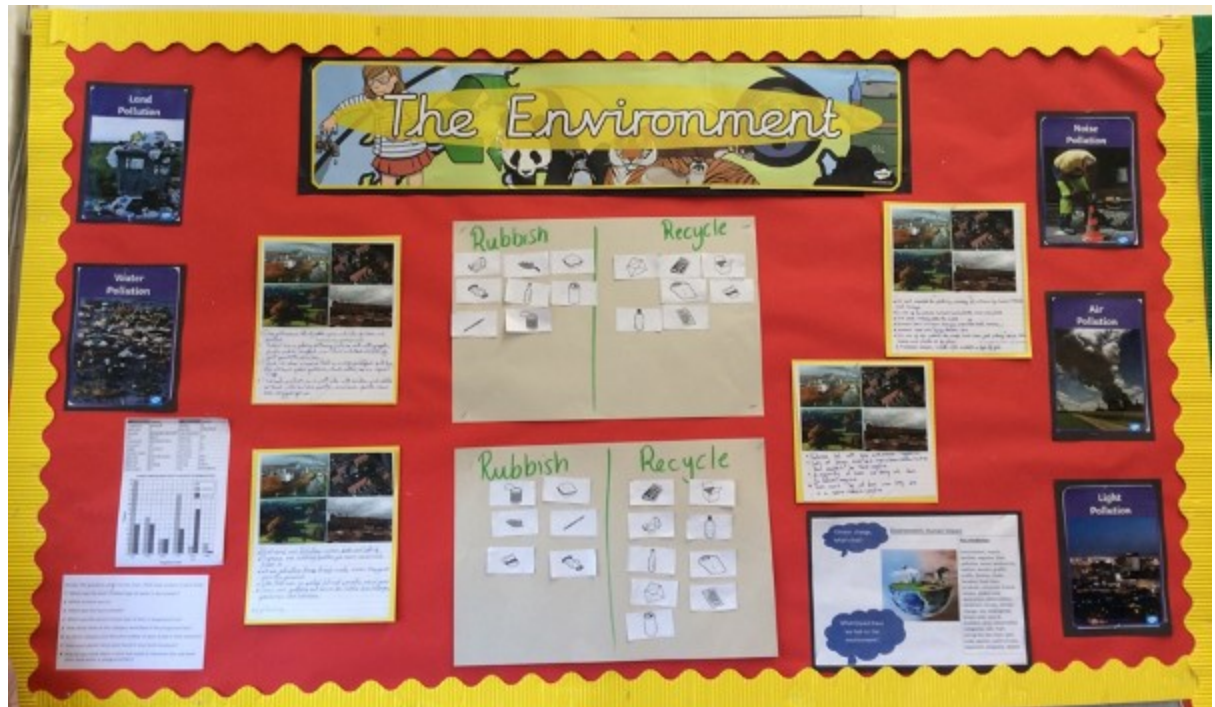
On the Year 5 trip to Southwark Cathedral, in the afternoon, the children made clay tiles that had different symbols which represented something in the Christian religion.
