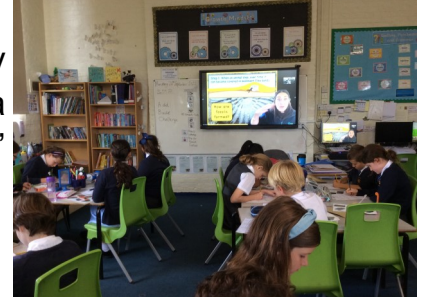
Y6 FOSSILS WORKSHOP
