## Measles

Measles is a very unpleasant illness that in some children can be very serious and lead to hospitalisation. Measles spreads very easily among those who are unvaccinated, especially in nurseries and schools. Vaccines are the best defence against diseases like measles.

We are urging all parents and carers to check that their children are up to date with their two MMR doses. To see if your child is up to date with their MMR vaccines, check your child's red book, NHS app or contact your GP practice.

If your child has missed one or both doses of the MMR vaccine, you can Book an appointment at your child's GP practice through the NHS app or by calling your GP practice.
