[Measles](#) is a highly infectious illness that can be very unpleasant. In some children it can have very serious consequences and lead to hospitalisation. Two doses of the [MMR vaccine](#) provides the best protection against measles.

Y5 Acacia Class

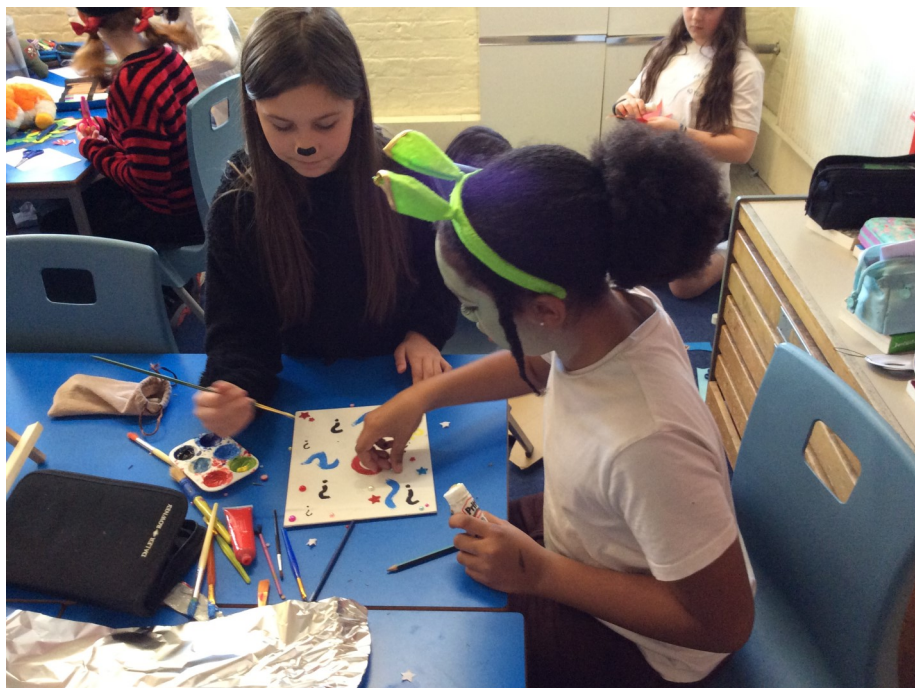

"The play made it feel like I was inside the really play, and was also acting like a narrator". Amelia

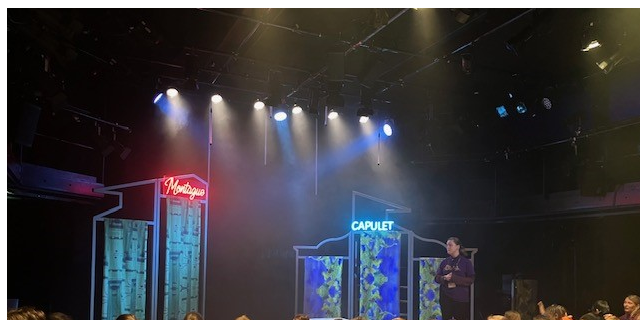
"It was super cool and it was a nice experience. The dancing and the singing were epic". Tahlia

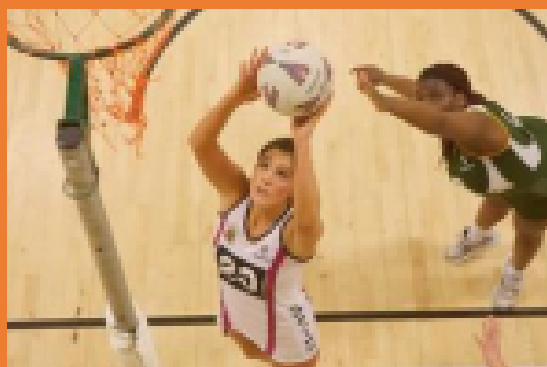
