Year 5 had the exciting opportunity to go to the Science Museum. We had to hunt around the museum to identify what forces different objects used. Then, we participated in a workshop demonstrating how many different forces worked, including air resistance, friction and upthrust. We had a great day of learning.

SCIENCE IN Y3

In science, we investigated if light travels in a straight line. We cut holes into several pieces of paper and shone the torchlight through them. We saw that when all the papers were aligned, the light could pass through, but when the papers were not in alignment, the light could not pass through. We also tested materials such as crushed velvet, felt, cotton, cling film, tweed and plastic to see if they were opaque, translucent or transparent.
