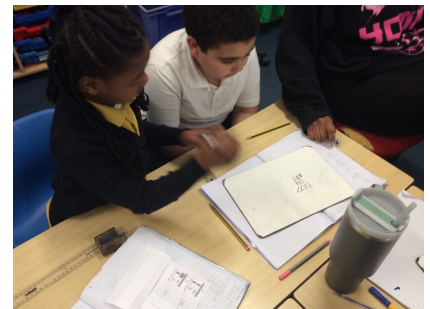
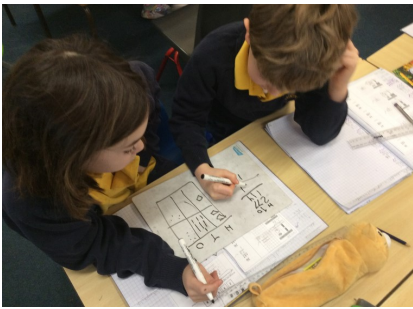


OUR LEARNING

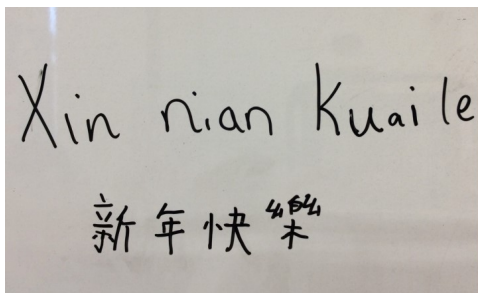
